<u>May Plate Sharing</u>: Boston Area Gleaners (BAG) is a nonprofit organization dedicated to supporting a more equitable, just, and sustainable food system.





With the support of the Town of

Acton, Acton Conservation Trust, Sudbury Valley Trustees, and individuals, BAG purchased Stonefield Farm in July of 2021. This enabled them to develop the Food Hub-- a wholesale market for local produce – providing income opportunities for farmers, and a much-needed farm-toinstitution supply line for local universities, hospitals, and food banks. Their vision is to sustain a permanent agricultural supply chain that will improve

the viability of local farms and the health of communities in the Boston metro area who have historically suffered from inequity in the food system.

As the pandemic government programs to ease food insecurity have ended, BAG is expanding its efforts at the farm itself. This summer they will grow produce such as collards, okra and callaloo that are in high demand but difficult to source locally. They invite community members to join them for volunteer gleaning "trips", and to attend the community gathering at the farm on June 22 where there will be music, food trucks, and an opportunity to enjoy the farm.


