## **Guest Speaker: CB Beal**

CB will share reflections on the idea of Preemptive Radical Inclusion as an entryway to increase justice and equity among ourselves and in the world, a way to embody beloved community in a time of physical isolation and social connection.

CB Beal, M.Div. (they, them, theirs) specializes in the facilitation of learning experiences that involve issues of marginalization, oppression, and privilege. Their focus is in the intersections of Preemptive Radical Inclusion, safer communities/congregations, supporting gender creative and trans/non-binary children and youth in youth-serving organizations, and sexuality/consent education. CB is the Unitarian Universalist Association's 2019 Angus H. MacLean Award for Excellence in Religious Education.

CB is a white, non-binary/genderqueer, mostly able-bodied fat person of sturdy farmer stock.

#### **RIA House**

So what and who is RIA House? We started in 2013 as a group of women wanting to support other women who have been trafficked, victimized, bought and SOLD for the gratification of another - mostly men. The key word here is "SOLD." Yes, "SOLD." Here we are in 2020 and still need to admit that a woman can be "SOLD." I believe this may be called Modern Day Slavery.

In the year 2019, RIA House has supported over 200 women by offering them clinical care, peer mentor ship as well as support groups in the MetroWest Prison for Women.

ALL these women have been traumatized and most suffer PTSD as well as drug and alcohol addiction. Some have had their identity stolen along with their cell phone, license and credit cards.

RIA House walks and stands with women who are trying to be a better citizen and give back. We ask that you stand with us as we continue to support these women.

#### The Rev. Mary Margaret Earl, Guest Minister

Who is Our Neighbor? A reflection on how we connect across racial and economic divides, especially in times of crisis.

The Rev. Mary Margaret Earl is Executive Director and Senior Minister of the Unitarian Universalist Urban Ministry. In this ministry, she has worked to strengthen bonds between UUs and the Roxbury neighborhood where the UUUM operates. She is on the Faith in Solidarity leadership team, which works to connect faith leaders with those impacted by poverty. Prior to her arrival at the UU Urban Ministry, she spent 10 years at a faith-based nonprofit in RI serving the homeless community. She is past president of the Board of the Rhode Island Coalition for the Homeless, recipient of the Heroes of Faith Award from the Rhode Island State Council of Churches for her interfaith work, and is a longtime vegan committed to standing up for nonhuman animals.
