SOUTHEAST INDIA PROJECT

Since the tsunami of 2004, FPC has supported the rural dalit villages and children of southeast India. This January would have been Bob Tabor's 17th trip (Russ Hart's 3rd, Vicky Tabor's 5th) to the villages and Orphanage. The pandemic caused us to cancel our scheduled visit again this year. We had to forgo the Friendship Kits that FPC families generously assemble each year for the children at the orphanage. Covid has drastically changed the lives at WIDE orphanage. We have helped fund a new building to increase the number of girls who can live at WIDE and enjoy a safe, healthy life and an education. All the children have recently been allowed by the government to return to the Orphanage and resume their education. Kumari, who operates WIDE with her husband and daughter, had been delivering food each month to each of the villages where the children are now dispersed, supporting their entire families. This has incurred extra expenses, and we have been sending her additional funding to support her efforts, as well as to supply food (rice, dal, spices, vegetables, milk) to a destitute Gypsy village and a refugee camp for Tamils who fled the civil war in Sri Lanka.

We also continue to support Women's Self-Help Groups in dalit villages as well as micro-loans to women for dairy herds, tailoring training and foot treadle sewing machines, and organic farming. Your continued generous support is greatly appreciated.

Religious Education



Children are the life blood of our community. The worship energy and often challenge the thinking of adults. Worship edemands on youth are many, yet many families want a spiritual grounding for their children and opportunities to be with friends in a supportive environment.

Vision: As part of our strategic plan, we want to provide an environment that is welcoming, encouraging and affirming to children as they grow emotionally, spiritually, and physically.

Plans to Date: We have hired a youth coordinator and created programs that are "out of the box" developing a curriculum that has an increased focus on building connections. We are continuing to offer rite of passage programs such as First Chalice, OWL, and Coming of Age.

Hybrid Worship

Online worship became a necessity during the pandemic, and over the past two years, FPC staff and volunteers rose to the challenge and put a huge amount of creativity and hard work into creating meaningful and creative online worship services.



With the return to in-person worship, many people still have a need to participate virtually. In keeping with our principles, as part of our strategic vision, we want to continue to enhance the Hybrid Worship experience to be as inclusive and welcoming as possible for those who need it.

Vision: Evolve the Hybrid Worship experience so that remote participants can engage as fully as possible during services - this enables the church to reach out to people who otherwise because of distance, health or other circumstances would not be able to participate.

Plans to date: To date, we've contracted with HB Communications to plan and install the equipment needed to optimize the Hybrid Worship experience. We've worked to build in options for full engagement for all participants in the Sanctuary as well as on Zoom. We have coordinated a volunteer group and have also hired tech support staff to run technology and troubleshoot during services.
