



May Plate Sharing:

Boston Area Gleaners

BAG began as a small volunteer effort focused on gleaning as a way to address food insecurity: harvesting surplus crops that would otherwise go to waste, and distributing them to people without access to healthy food. Since the early 2000's, it has grown to become the largest gleaning organization in the northeast, and through their distribution program they deliver fresh food to a network of local food pantries, shelters, and meal programs, and provide trucking support to partner non-profits and farms in need of resources.

With the support of other organizations, BAG purchased Stonefield Farm in 2021 and developed the Food Hub, a wholesale market for local produce, providing income opportunities for farmers and a much-needed farm-to-institution supply line for local universities, hospitals, and food banks. Their vision is to sustain a permanent agricultural supply chain that will improve the viability of local farms and the health of communities in the Boston metro area who have historically suffered from inequity in the food system. You can read more about BAG's plans for addressing ongoing nutritional challenges in our state, and volunteer gleaning "trips" at local farms
