The New Revival Coffeehouse is back!



New Revival will present a streaming concert on Saturday Dec. 5 at 7:30 p.m. featuring two fine musicians - Celia Woodsmith & Joe K. Walsh.

Celia is a Grammy-nominated vocalist, performer and

songwriter. The Bluegrass Situation described her vocal style as one of a kind: gritty, muscular, folksy and intimate sometimes all at once."

The Boston Globe said she is "unvarnished and intimate…but then sounds like she's about to part the Dead Sea."

She is a member of the all-women Nashville-based bluegrass band Della Mae. In 2014 Della Mae was nominated for a Grammy for Best Bluegrass Album for their record "This World Oft Can Be."

Mandolinist and songwriter Joe K. Walsh comes out of the New England roots music scene. A musician's musician, he has played with a number of prominent artists like

Darol Anger and the Gibson Brothers.

His new album "Borderland" features roots musicians like fiddlers Bruce Molsky and Brittany Haas, and banjo player Gabe Hershfeld. The songs include Joe's own lyrics, as well as poems by W.B. Yeats that he set to music.
