### Fall 2021 Apple Pie Project





The First Parish Church of Stow and Acton Apple Pie Project is a GO for fall 2021! Since the pandemic is still "a thing", we will be following similar procedures to last year. See below for how we plan to make the Apple Pie Project happen this fall!

Dough making: Dough making will take place in the Fellowship Hall Kitchen on Wednesday evenings (time somewhat negotiable).

The Mallon Family has offered to coach/supervise vaccinated volunteers each week in the dough making process. We prefer members of a single family unit sign up in a given week (it's hard to social distance when making dough together, so having volunteers from the same family unit will help keep folks safe). Volunteers will be asked to wear masks while in the building.



Apple collecting This is generally an easy social distancing activity as it occurs outdoors and folks tend to do it in family groups. We will continue with the apple collecting process as usual, but we will ask that folks wear masks when collecting near other folks outside of their family. As with last year, apples will be collected on Tuesdays and Wednesdays and delivered to the church by 4pm Wednesday. Shelburne farm has assured us that the apples will be large this year, due to the wet summer.:)

Apple peeling/prep Our past method of coming together in community to peel apples at church simply is not a safe option at this time. Instead, we will be asking volunteers to wash, peel, and prepare apples at home as we did last year. Apples can be picked up by individuals from the church on Wednesday afternoons between the hours of 4-7 pm.

Most likely the apples will be located in bins behind the vestry (This is a NEW LOCATION. To get to the apple bins, you

would drive down the driveway between the church and the library; they will be located near the back vestry door) The new location will be confirmed closer to the date.

Peelers are asked to take the apples home, wash them, peel them, core them, and cut them into pie slices. Bags for the cleaned apple slices to be stored in will be provided. Peelers can drop off the apple bags and bags of slices in the bins at the church before 9 pm Thursday where volunteers will collect and store the apple slices overnight.4 (NOTE: If you choose to peel your apples on Wednesday or early on Thursday, please refrigerate them until you are ready to deliver them.)

Folks are encouraged to host Zoom sessions or outdoor gatherings if they would like to socialize with others while they peel and some SGMs may also conduct their own Zoom/peeling sessions.

**Baking** To meet social distancing guidelines, our *Friday morning baking* 

routine will be similar to last year. All volunteers will be asked to wear masks while in the building.

If needed, we will work in shifts for each of the areas to limit the number of people in the building per guidelines at the time. With social distancing of 6 feet followed, there is room in the Fellowship Hall Kitchen for 3 individuals to space out along the counter along the windows to roll dough and 2 individuals at the metal table in the center of the kitchen for rolling/crimping. There is also room for an additional person to move through the right entry door and reach the oven to load in and take out pies when needed.

Filling the dough will take place in the Hall with individuals or "same household groups" each being assigned a separate table.

Pies will be returned to a table outside the kitchen where they will be retrieved by the kitchen volunteers to place on the top crust and prepare the pies to go in the oven. Bagging: Bagging will take place in the Fellowship Hall as usual. With 2-3 volunteers bagging, there will be plenty of room for social distancing, but folks could stagger when they bag as well, if desired. All baggers will be asked to wear masks in the building.

Selling: Rather than selling out of the pie shed, we will again be asking pie purchasers to pull up to the front doors of the church, where they can line up to purchase pies from within their cars.

Sellers will be asked to wear a mask, regardless of vaccination status. They will be provided with gloves to wear during their shift and will be asked to sanitize their gloves between each purchase.

Quantities/Price How many pies we will be able to make depends on how many folks are willing to volunteer! We will plan to make our normal number of pies (roughly 80 a week) but will adjust as needed. Our plan is to keep the price per pie to \$18, which is in keeping with the price of pies at our local farm stands.

When to start/what to offer Our current plan is to begin the project the week of Sept. 22nd, with the first sales being on Saturday September 25th. The project will run the usual 4 weeks, ending the week AFTER Columbus Day/Indigenous People's Day weekend (so our last weekend of sales will be October 16-17th

This is later than we've started/run the project before...let's see what happens! Since it is likely we are not going to have the fair this year, we are hoping to offer a variety of jams/jellies, pickles and baked goods that will be prepackaged and ready to sell along with the pies. This was very popular last year! We will have a list each week of what is available for purchasers to choose from (selection will vary from week to week). Rebecca has reusable take out containers for anyone who plans to bake cakes or similar desserts for individual servings.

Sign ups: Like last year, signing up in advance for roles in the pie project will be super important, especially with

regard to the new plans for peeling and baking. An announcement will be made in early September when the on-line sign ups are ready. Folks did a great job last year...let's keep up the good work!!

Bathroom Use In the Building Like last year, folks will be asked to minimize use of the church restrooms if possible. If an urgent need arises, we will ask folks to use the small all gender bathroom outside of Fellowship Hall and will keep the door open in between users to improve ventilation and follow all instructions posted in the bathroom.
