FPC 2022 Summer Services June 19 ~ September 4

Here are details of the 12 services that FPC is offering this summer. Each service starts at 10am, and for the first t i me since the pandemic began more than 2 years ago all except one can be attended in person—some will take place in Fellowship Hall, a few outside on the church grounds (weather permitting), and several more in the Sanctuary that will also be broadcast online through Zoom. Childcare will be provided for all in-person services.

Some details could change because of Covid protocols and other eventualities, so be sure to check the FPC website or watch for information via FPCAnnounce.

June 19 "This I Believe" (in the Sanctuary and online on Zoom) John Kendrick, Johanna Pyle, Sandi Mrowka, and Derek McCarthy will share their personal beliefs, the core values that guide their daily lives, and what makes them tick religiously and spiritually.

June 26 "Life at the Intersections" (in Fellowship Hall) This service, coordinated by the Racial Justice Task Force, will explore the ways that our lives, the diversity of our world, and our social justice efforts intersect. Through music, readings, and the morning sermon reflection, the congregation will be encouraged to explore the intersections of their own lives—and the challenges and opportunities that awareness of life in the intersections can bring to our work for social justice.

July 3 "UUA General Assembly" (online on Zoom)
Join us for a recording of the previous Sunday's service at General Assembly, held this year in Portland, Oregon. It is the largest annual gathering of dedicated UUs joined together in worship. This service will be online only, and we will post the link on FPCAnnounce and the FPC website.

July 10 "Annual Summer Jazz Service" (in Fellowship Hall) Our own Parish Jazz Band, led by Michael Paladini, will play great jazz classics for everyone to enjoy, all packaged in a UU wrapper.

Join Susan Avery with your animal(s) or representation of them as we explore the power they have to lift our spirit and then collectively bless each of them.
