NOVEMBER PLATE SHARING OUR PARTNER CHURCH

Unitarianism has deep and wide roots of which most of us are not aware. Some of those roots extend into the Transylvania region of Romania, where Unitarianism briefly flourished. Some of the principles of freedom of belief had their origin there; however, it is today a minority religion in a country with a national religion of Christian orthodoxy, in a region populated by Hungarian speakers, who are not well accepted by many Romanians.

FPC has a partner congregation in the tiny village of Olasztelek. Every year at Christmas, FPC makes a gift to this community that – as some of us discovered when we visited in 2016 – makes a very big difference in the lives of some of their parishioners. The congregation includes a number of quite elderly people who have a hard time making it through the winter without help. While we are striving to make our relationship one of "parity, not charity" (as suggested by the UU Partner Church Council), history has not been kind to the people of this region.

The Partner Church committee last year distributed the last of the funds earmarked for this purpose. The gifts are not supported in the general budget, but are made from plate sharing. The committee asks that the church continue to support this tradition. Thank you for your generosity!
